Dearest Friends,

I thought I was so ahead of things when I got the newsletter out in plenty of time and now am way behind again.

Of course, the major issue at present is the pandemic. I am not being flippant about it, and while I know that Jesus is my Healer, we need to be wise at this time. REPORT FROM PASTOR SHADRECK

I greet you in the name of our Lord Jesus and hope that you are well. The Lord has been faithful to us and continues to preserve and take us from glory to glory. We are truly grateful for your prayers and support which continue to propel our work and vision forward. I am extremely happy to report that the women in my church have become evangelists in my village and are preaching and leading more people to the Lord. We used to have 20 families in my home church but through the evangelism in the women's ministry we are now a church of 103 families. I am in awe of what the Lord is doing by growing our church which has all been possible because of the vision to get women and the youth active in the church by giving them equal opportunity to attend the Bible School in Chididi as well as through the continuous women' and youth conferences. We are pioneers in this sort of ministry in our region and so have become the spearheading force that is here to reach out and touch so many lives as well as pave the way for future generations who will bear the torch for Christ. (Ed note: It is our plan to extend this church in the next three months. It will cost us about \$1,500 to do this).

It saddens me when I go around and see all the dying crops in our fields because I know that we must endure another long spell of food shortage up here in the mountains. We praise the Lord for the good rains He blessed us with during the previous farming season so some have stock that we saved. The government seldom ever implements their fertilizer subsidy program up here which makes it difficult for the underprivileged to have a good crop. Our friends in the Shire valley are blessed to have access to whatever small plots of land that are suitable for irrigation farming and so will have some sort of a breather unlike those who live in Chididi and beyond, whose fate lies in the hands of the government. Government alleviation programs seem exist only on paper. Furthermore, it seems there will not be much left in the gardens since most people are already salvaging whatever maize has dried out and milling it for food, which means they will have a low harvest next month. Such is the reality on the ground and we can only pray that the Lord grants us a miracle.

Looking at our incumbent predicament I thought it was an opportune time to spread the message of love and unity among all God's creation for we will surely depend on one another in the months to come. Africans have not had the opportunity to do away with the extend family values and thus believe in community living which can serve as an advantage when disaster strikes since people are compelled to help each other. But we have seen such values as the urge to give a lending hand to a struggling neighbor diminish because of changing times. People have become selfish and we must adapt and practice AGAPE love. When we love unconditionally, we will not turn a blind eye to our neighbor who is suffering beyond his abilities or turn a deaf ear to the moaning of children around us. I know that love never fails, it is the purest gift God gave mankind and we know it is good because there is not a single soul alive today that does not yearn to be loved. I know I want to feel that I am worthwhile and that if I ever needed saving, my closest friends and family would be there to lend me helping hand. Such was the message I took with me to all my house groups for when the storm comes, all we have is each other, and we will not be able to support and care for one another if we have no love in us.

In summary, I would like to say that we are keeping you all in our prayers as this COVID19 pandemic continues to spread across the world. Our prayers are with you that the Lord preserves you and keeps you well, and that all the necessary institutions employed in dealing with this pandemic find lasting solutions and cohesively work to preserve lives. You would assume that my conduct was that of a typical pastor's son, gentle and with good manners, but I have had a troubled upbringing and was quite unruly in my late teens. I left my home and moved to Pastor Shadreck's village where the Lord got a hold me. My sister decided it was a good idea for me to live with her and away from my father with whom I was in constant conflict. No sooner had I started spending more time at church than the responsibilities came. I was charged with teaching Sunday school kids and I thought what a job to give a former troubled kid with no experience and no patience that it takes to teach children. I am so grateful that now I have this opportunity to study the word of God so that I can be an effective teacher for the next generation of Malawian leaders. It is our duty to raise our children in the ways of God and that is why I love this Bible so much. The leadership has taken strides to make sure that our communities will have people who have the word at heart and thus raise a righteous generation that gives glory to God in heaven. I used to be a security guard at a sugar plantation in Nkhotakota and for me, there is no lonelier job in the world than working in a sugar plantation. It was during these lonely moments when I was sitting in a watch tower somewhere, that I began to seek the Lord. I found comfort in praise and music and prayer but still did not develop a deeper and intimate relationship with God. I returned to Chididi after my mother's passing and continued to seek the Lord everywhere I went. Whether I was tilling the land in my garden or walking in the forests, I worshipped until I began to hear His voice and the purpose He has for my life. I found guidance in my new journey at the Bible school. I have seen my life completely change after I allowed the Lord to take charge of my life and obeyed His will to go forth and spread the Gospel.

REPORT FROM FRANCIS

We send you our regards and pray that this finds you well. It is our hope and prayer that the Lord preserves you as the entire world has been overwhelmed by the corona virus pandemic. It is our prayer that the Lord comes through for His people and that He inspires the necessary institutions to come up with drastic innovations to combat such a pandemic.

Malawi has had a fair share of both groundbreaking and saddening moments following ongoing political imbalances for almost a year now. The Judicial institutions and human rights activist groups have come out in the open to oppose the incumbent government on three occasions and there seems to be some hope to end the charade which has shut down progress in all sectors for the past nine months. If all goes well, it seems the nation will be heading to polling stations again on the 16th of May 2020. It is our hope and prayer that we continue to maintain peace and we would like to implore you to keep this nation in your prayers.

The harvest is upon us and reports indicate that there has been a good rain all year round with a few exceptions in drought prone regions and other regions due to financial dilemmas. There are at least six districts in the southern region of Malawi that have been greatly affected and recent reports show acute food shortages. In Nsanje, which is our focus area, most of the maize (Corn) crop did not do well as a result of leaching. In some areas which received more rain the fertilizer was washed away and in others the people were unable to access fertilizer since the government fertilizer subsidy program is very ineffective. Nsanje will have a serious food shortage problem with some respite for those who can afford to buy maize coming from the Central region of Malawi however pricy that maybe. Nevertheless, we have been fortunate to receive the rainfall we have, as our neighbors - Mozambique and Zambia have not been so fortunate.

We will soon have our Easter conference which gives us a wonderful opportunity to reflect on our lives and have fellowship with our loved ones. I am looking forward to celebrating Easter with the elderly in Chididi, I wish that some of you could join us some day. Remember to follow all the precautionary directions medical professionals are advising to minimize the risk of the COVID 19 virus. We pray that the Lord grants us all favor and His hand of protection should hover over us during these times. May the Almighty God Bless and Reward you tenfold.
