Wearing white for a pure bride is the closest we can come to the beautiful wedding apparel we will have at the marriage

supper of the lamb. Our apparel represents the righteous acts of the saints. The vows go on to say, *"Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself for her, that He might sanctify and cleanse her with the washing of water by the word, that He might present her to Himself a glorious church, not having spot or wrinkle or any such thing, but that she should be holy and without blemish"* (Eph 5: 25-27).

In years past parents chose the bridegroom for their daughter and who knows us better than our parents? In this modern day and age, we have traveled far from this concept, but it is God who chooses the bride for His Son and if are born again and love the Lord we should allow Him to choose our husband here on earth. There is much preparation for a wedding just as we have much to prepare for our heavenly wedding. We are still not sure of the outcome of this ongoing tussle for power with both the aggrieved and accused parties continuing their quests to seek justice and to consolidate power. Nevertheless, the Lord has been truly faithful to us throughout all this chaos.

We are ever passionate about reaching out to young people and sharing the gospel at every opportunity that we can get. Pastors Peter and Shadreck recently led a three-day youth seminar in the mountains of Nthondo. This world has been overly blessed with people with a unique set of gifts and abilities needless to mention the diversity in passions and calling too. It is always wonderful to see people getting on with and excelling in their career paths, yet it is so common to hear people say they happy and comfortable with what they are doing. However, many have a certain calling, gifting and passion about something they have never really attempted to pursue or invest so little time in. Instead of being innovators they are content to be spectators all their lives.

Everything happens so fast these days and it could be that sometimes we are so busy with our careers that we seldom ever have enough time for other things. Either that, or we simply gave up on our aspirations. In Luke 5:1-11 we see the Lord Jesus preaching at the Sea of Galilee and thereafter charging Peter and friends to cast their nets into the deep after they spent the previous night at sea and came back with empty nets. Peter being the experienced fisherman he was, could have easily said: "I have been out at sea all night and caught nothing so what makes you certain that we can catch something now?" He could have said, "Rabi you know more about carpentry and I know the best time to fish is at night," or that when Jesus was teaching, the noise that came from the gathering crowds scared the fish away and it would have made sense, but he did not protest. Instead Peter says, "Master we have toiled all night and caught nothing; nevertheless, at your word I will let down the net."

Often, we are afraid to pursue our calling because we have absolutely no idea of how that may work for us or the things we will have to endure. There's always that fear of the unknown things that creeps in and sows the seed of doubt and procrastination. Ministry is a tough choice for any young man to answer to because it is not glamorous and exciting as everyone thinks. It takes faith and even though we are so quick to preach about it we seldom walk it out in our lives. Sometimes the challenges we face like Peter coming up with empty nets, the risks and uncertainties of being called to parts of the world you did not want to be in might be more than a little overwhelming. Sleeping in a tent is not so comfortable like the unexpected rigors a fisherman would have to bear at sea. But, if we can have faith like Peter, to say though I poured my guts out, suffered a cold night at sea and came back empty handed, I will trust in the Lord to cast my net into the deep. Peter did not give up but listened in obedience and in the end their nets were bursting with fish

We are excited for the young people who are actively investing their time in ministry as well as pursuing their careers. We are so overjoyed that the remnant has boldly risen to stand in the gap and preach love to the world. We pray that they will continue to case their nets and the return will be plentiful thus changing the nature and atmosphere of an area which has always been a headquarters for witchcraft.

May our net always be full. Let us not be satisfied with one or two fish but may we ask for a full net. If Jesus did it for Peter, then He will do it for you and me and He is the One that gives increase. We just must be obedient and do the work He has called us to. He has equipped us with all that we need. Time is short and it seems that the laborers are few. Let us encourage and exhort and be instruments of His work. He has gifted each one of us so let us use what He has given.

In my village we say that a family is blessed when you receive guests on a timely basis, and I was overly blessed on the 26<sup>th</sup> of July when we hosted the three-day youth conference at my church. I would like to encourage Pastor Peter and Francis to continue teaching and supporting the youth to rise and grow up into maturity in Christ. Revelations 12:11 says *"They have triumphed over him by the blood of the Lamb and the by the word of their testimony; and they loved not their lives unto the death."* I sent my daughter to get a few supplies from Tenganani on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of July and the only comfortable mode of transport is hired motorbikes. There are about two steep slopes on the way down which make the journey somewhat precarious if your brakes are not in good condition which is usually the case with these hired bikes. The bike lost brakes on their way down the second slope and my daughter fell of the bike first then the owner followed afterwards. The bike was badly damaged they had to carry it out of there. The owner survived serious injuries and he was rushed to Queen Elizabeth Hospital in Blantyre. Our prayers are with him and we praise the Lord that my daughter survived the accident without a single scratch on her body.

On the same July 22<sup>nd</sup>, I had a Bible study with the elderly when suddenly someone noticed that we were one member short. No sooner
