Before I went to Africa, I told my staff to look for a truck. I had \$5,000 and knew it would cost at least \$14,000. Three days before I left, I had a young family from out of town over for dinner. I had been in Iowa and arrived home an hour before they were due to come for dinner. We had a wonderful evening and after they left, I went to clean the table. There was a piece of paper on it and I was about to throw it in the trash and realized it was a check. God's arithmetic is always spot on. When I got to Africa the truck was there, but they wanted \$2,000 more than was in God's budget. I offered them brand new \$100 bills which no-one in Africa will turn down, so they dropped the price to God's budget. Because we have so many women, we need a dormitory for them. I purchased much of the

Cement and lime that was needed to rebuild an existing house and told them to go ahead with the renovations. Someone donated toward that and we now have a comfortable place for the ladies when they attend the Bible School. God is faithful and when He directs, we need to step out in faith.

We are pleased to report that the first stage on the Tengani church building is complete, we will now be looking to finish with the roofing and wall finishing touches soon. We are grateful to the Lord for this undertaking and we thank you our dearly beloved for your provisions which will greatly contribute towards enriching spiritual lives.

We have lost one of the ladies who was cooking for the elderly during distributions and at prayer meetings. We were together at the crusade and a week later Francis and I visited her at her house. She came to church on Sunday the 13th of October, had fun singing praise songs and dancing with her husband, after which she went to teach the youth on the importance of prayer. We were all stunned to hear that she had passed on a literally two hours after the service.

On page one is the Tengani church. Earlier in the year it was blown over by a tornado in a freak storm. We now have built it with double bricks and as soon as the finances come in it will be roofed and they will be able to use it. We need another \$3,000 for timber and for the corrugated iron sheets.

Pastor Peter and his wife have faithfully grown their church even though they have had to meet outside in all weather. It was shocking to see the walls laying flat on the ground after the storm in February but so exciting to see the walls are ready for struts and roofing. The timber for the struts must come from Blantyre as timber locally is much thinner and still damp. It certainly will not hold up to the winds that sometimes blow in Tengani. The corrugated roofing also must be brought in from Blantyre as it is the only place we can get the thicker iron – there is nothing available locally.

We plan to hold the official opening February 2nd and there will be much rejoicing in the whole area.

This will be a beacon in an area that is steeped in witchcraft and superstition and already things are changing because of the teaching of the Gospel which is a lamp unto our feet and a light unto our path.

REPORT FROM PASTOR FRANCIS

We send you greetings from the Alabaster family in the Warm heart of Africa and pray that you are all well. We have an urgent call for prayer following the recent wave of violent attacks on civilians and the armed forces in Malawi. There has been a rise in violent attacks from overzealous factions in the country following the ongoing protest against the election results in May. Conflict between armed police and civilians has been the order of the day and at times the army has had to step into calm hostilities on both sides. However, it is the recent attacks on police and in some cases, people posing as the police which has resulted in the loss of life and severe injuries suffered, coupled with shocking loss of property. We pray that the Lord intervenes in this predicament so that this peaceful nation may once again celebrate the love that makes us the Warm Heart of Africa. We would also like to pray for neighboring Mozambique who are about to have elections of their own with respect to the hostilities between the FRELIMO and RENAMO parties who have been at war for a long time. We praise the Lord that the church building at Tengani is nearly complete, soon we will be putting the roof on finish up on the flooring and plaster. We thank you for your faithfulness and perpetual support. We are grateful to the Lord for making Tengani Church a beacon of light and a pillar of hope in the area especially under the leadership of Pastor Peter Kankoché. It is not common that local leaders, especially the chiefs are found in church but because Pastor Kankoché is such a humble soul the Lord is using him in an amazing way so much that there are 4 major chiefs in his church. It is true the Lord blesses a nation or a family because of their leader. God blessed Israel because of one man who was after God's own heart, the Lord blesses a family because of a prayerful father, and so it is true with a God-fearing administration in any organization. May the Lord continue to use Peter to achieve his purpose at Tengani and beyond.

Alabaster ministries held another bible school class in Chididi from the 7th to the 11th of October 2019. The courses were run in an intensive manner and we are pleased to report that all students in attendance participated and performed well. We took Laston Joseph with us to go and minister to Nkopola, 20 kilometers south of Chididi. They performed well and we have faith the young team will go on to assist the graduates from last year after their graduation.

My church is helping some of the elderly in their gardens because it is hard work tilling the ground which isn't suitable for the elderly, but they are being forced to work because most of them do not have anyone to help them.

We pray that there should be lasting solutions to the chaos in Malawi and lasting peace in Mozambique. May the Grace and Peace of the Lord be with you always, Amen.

Shadreck once again taught at this past Bible School. It is very exciting to see how the graduates from the last Bible School have grown and progressed in the things of the Lord. Even if we had a 10% success rate, I would still consider everything worthwhile, but the rate has been far higher than that. Churches are growing rapidly and every area in which we have churches are also changing because of the Gospel message.

TRUCK: Thanks to some very dear friends we were finally able to purchase our truck. It is going to take so much pressure off building projects and distribution and means we will no longer have to pay exorbitant prices to hire a truck. It is a five-ton Mitsubishi with an extra-long wheelbase. We had the mechanic drive it and go over everything and he said it was a "steal." We also found parts for our Nissan which broke down on my last trip and that will be in great working order by the time I return in the New Year.
