Dearest Partners and Friends,

I just completed my trip around the Eastern Seaboard and Mid-West. It has been wonderful to spent time with old friends and to make many new ones. New doors have opened and it has been exciting to see what God does. I put almost 8,000 miles on my little car and am blessed that it is a hybrid.

I believe that God is going to pour out His Spirit on America just one more time because He loves us and because He is merciful and full of grace. Do we deserve it – definitely NO especially after some of the latest decisions made by this government.

"But of that day and hour no one knows, no, not even the angels of heaven, but My Father only. But as the days of Noah were, so also will the coming of the Son of Man be. For as in the days before the flood, they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day that Noah entered the ark, and did not know until the flood came and took them all away, so also will the coming of the Son of Man be."

Ultimately it is the fault of us, as individuals in the Body of Christ because we have been prayer less. Things happen because God has a people in the nations of the earth who are supposed to cry out to Him under the direction of the Holy Spirit. It is time for us to begin to intercede on behalf of this nation and the nations of the world. We tolerate what is happening because it is politically correct which makes us "man pleasers" in the sight of God. He is the only One we are here to please. Since when did tolerating something line up with His Word?

It is time for each of us in the Body of Christ to repent for our laziness in developing our relationship with Him first and then for not carrying out the Great Commission. There are only two things we are going to take to heaven with us when we go – that is how much we love Him (in the here and now) and souls. souls, souls. That is the burden of God's heart – the lost and dying.

A group of us get together at 6.00 am Central each week day to pray for an hour and it is a glorious way to begin the day. We pray that God would be glorified in this nation and that He would once again pour out here through His people. Are you His people? If we are willing then He will use us but we have to make ourselves available. We cannot be so busy about our own business that we do not recognize someone on the street or in the store that is in need. These are the open doors that God gives us each and every day to make a difference in someone's life.

As I traveled through Indiana I saw a little of the revival taking place there especially in the church. Northern Indiana is experiencing it amongst the Amish people but the rest of Indiana does not appear to have heard about it and what is worse they do not seem to even care that they are not experiencing it. This has come about because a young man began to pray and was joined by others. When we begin to pray effectively we

have to do something. When we hear from God we have to be **RESPONSIBLE** with what we hear. He will always remind us of the Great Commission. That is what is happening in Northern and Central Indiana. The churches are getting together to pray and are sending out teams to witness. Charles Finny never went anywhere unless he sent his two intercessors ahead of him to prepare the ground. It does not always happen that way but I am believing that as time gets shorter we will be able to reap all the sooner. When we hear about some of the great missionaries who left the shores of Europe and America we see that often they never saw a harvest in their lifetime but decades and sometimes centuries later someone else came behind and reaped a mighty harvest. There are harvest fields all over the world that have already been prepared. The land has been ploughed, the seed has been sown and it has been watered by the tears of the saints and now it is time for us to arise from our beds of ivory and our dinners of fatted lamb and go out to the fields and work. Time is short, *"behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation."* 2 Cor 6:2

Nyale Kalish emigrated from Mozambique to Malawi when she was 14 years of age. Throughout her life she has been alone. She never married and does not have any children. She told us that during the days of her youth she was a very troublesome girl. She was known to steal from people. As a young lady she was very beautiful. That drew the attention of many men and she never said no to these men but rather embraced them all and had countless of sexual relations with different men. This was the kind of lifestyle that Nyale knew. As she grew older she never left this lifestyle. She found her joy in dancing - she loved to dance. With no husband or family Nyale is faced with difficulties in carrying out her everyday tasks such as using the bathroom. She cannot move around without her walking stick and her vision which was somewhat blurry for years has ended up in blindness. She frequently has back ache and general body pains. However, she thanks God that Alabaster came in and shared the Word. It has brought a revelation of truth which is the Gospel into her life, giving her the courage to let go of her past. It has changed her life and since then she has been forever grateful to Alabaster for the gift that has been given to her - that gift being Jesus. She is now a born again and has denounced her past. She said that if it was through her own will she would have walked straight to heaven but she is waiting for the day that God calls her. She is very happy and joyful because of the new life she leads in the presence of the Lord.

Nyale is 99 years old and just lost her sister Belita of 97 years who featured in our May newsletter. How thrilled I was that I could spend time with Belita on my last trip. This is why we need to build a center as Nyale has no-one to care for her. The center will cost us \$5,000 to begin with.

MALAWI

It is time once again to prepare for our trip to Malawi. We are leaving September 13 and I will be accompanied by Adele Parker from Florida. The program will be much the same as usual. We will purchase all the items necessary for distribution and then leave for the villages. We have decided that it is better to give the elderly money for their maize instead of giving them the maize itself. It is cheaper for them to purchase and have it ground than it is for us to purchase in Blantyre and haul it down. A bag weighs 23 pounds in addition to the sugar, salt and whatever else we distribute and it is too heavy for some of them to carry. We have been told that sometimes when they go back to their homes they are offered help by children who then run off with it and steal it. Hard to believe that this type of thing takes place! Money will be easier to hide on their persons and we will give them a purse that they can carry around their waist. This will also enable us to use a smaller truck which will cut down on the fuel costs.

At one stage I was hoping that we would not have to build except for the cottages but I realize that that was but a dream!

I would like to fill you in for the vision for the land on which we have begun to build.

We have a workshop/storage building and are in the process of building the pastor's house.

We plan to have the center for the elderly and for those who really cannot take care of themselves the Pastor's wife will cook and clean for them.

We will need a small clinic with 24 hour nursing containing four beds, two for each, male and female.

A conference center which will be used as a church and if there are future floods it will be a place of refuge for those who are displaced, especially the elderly. We will keep chickens and plan on having a vegetable garden so that we can feed those who are on the property.

There will also be a house for staff and visiting missionaries from overseas. There is one more section of land next to ours. Please pray that the doors will open for us to purchase that land. We are making enquires as to who it belongs to.

If there is some way that we can make this village self-supporting then we will try to find it. We also need a

home for some of the girls and perhaps we would be able to teach them some form of craft that could not only generate funding but also give them something to do once they leave school.

We have a primary school across the road from the property which the younger girls would be able to attend.

We have already planted numerous trees on the property and as and when the buildings are completed we will grass and plant shrubs and flowers. This will not just be an oasis in the desert to the eye but it will be an oasis for those who hunger for righteousness and thirst after God.

It will be a place of refuge for those who have suffered and need a place of safety.

I do not know how it will get done but He does and so we will walk one step at a time together with Him until at such a time the vision will come to pass. It is His plan and His purpose.

"For the vision is yet for an appointed time, but at the end it shall speak, and not lie: though it tarry, wait for it; because it will surely come, it will not tarry." Hab 2:3

Please keep this project in prayer and if possible support it in any way that you can. I would love for you to all be able to come and see..... come and meet the "cotton candies," the girls who had no hope, the young people who were in such rebellion. Each and every one is a miracle. We hunger for miracles but salvation is the greatest miracle of all.

We name all the cottages "Abba's House." Perhaps we should name the village "Oasis of Hope."

Our next project is to build the house for the Pastor on site. This will cost approximately \$1000. It will consist of two bedrooms, a kitchen and a living area. The fence around the property will go in as soon as we can get the metal fence posts as we are having real trouble trying to find poison that will prevent the termites.

- Cottages for the elderly 10 x \$5,000
- Fence the property in Tengani \$4000
- Build the pastor's house \$1300 (This has been paid for)
- Roof 5 houses in the mountains \$ 400 (This has been paid for)
- Drill the well in the mountains \$4000 (this has already been paid for)

Start the center for those elderly who can no longer take care of themselves consisting of four double rooms and a meeting hall which can be added on to. \$10,000 - \$5,000 to start with addition in the future

We also want to distribute four times this year since we have noticed how hungry many of the elderly are. \$5000 per distribution.
