"My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me; and I give eternal life to them, and they shall never perish; and no one shall snatch them out of My hand," (John 10:27-28).

REPORT FROM PASTOR ERIC

I was helping at a funeral at my friend's church a few weeks ago and as always there is a lot of talk that goes on at funerals. People come inquiring as to what has happened, they give their condolences and the men start talking sport, politics, or anything that will take their minds away from the tragedy that has befallen us. We were of course sitting on the ground in large crowds as is the case with most African funerals and that was when we were reminded of the dangers of being affected by the corona virus since there was very little physical distancing observed. There was a deep silence when most people learned that the deceased was a young girl aged sixteen and committed suicide because she was felt rejected by her stepmother and relatives. It was a somber moment because such things should not be happening in the body of Christ. The Lord Jesus loved us so much that He was prepared to demonstrate that love even unto His death on that cross. This young lady was lacking something the community could have given her. We all failed her because someone should have seen her pain and stretched out a helping hand. The church should rise to the challenges we are facing in our area. There are so many broken families and scarred people in Nsanje that only Jesus can heal. I am asking you our dearly beloved friends to help us in prayer that we can reach out to as many people as possible and share with them just how much the unconditional love of God can do to a person in need.

We are currently going through a difficult time in Malawi. We had a lot of rain but poor yields due leaching of fertilizers to the extent that recent studies have revealed that only 21 out of a hundred families have sufficient food throughout the year. Our health infrastructure is ill equipped to combat Covid-19, our political and already poor economic systems are failing. We have seen people taking to the streets to demonstrate their dissatisfaction with the way their rights were represented in the electoral process which the High Court and Supreme Court of Malawi have nullified. We are expecting another general election on 2nd July 2020 and already some factions are getting tribal in their ideology which will only divide the unity that makes this place The Warm Heart of Africa. The Word of God reminds us that even though we live in this world, we are not of this world. Our traditions and customs should not depict a worldly nature but a character that symbolizes the Love of Christ and the light that He bears. The problems we have are mostly born of our ambitious nature to be first in all things. There is absolutely nothing wrong with ambition and setting up high goal for oneself but doing so at the detriment of others is morally wrong. The corruption that epitomizes our political system is shocking and we pray that the Lord should intervene in this situation.

We are always happy when brother Francis visits our church to have fellowship with us. Sometimes I travel with him when he goes to visit other churches but it is always a blessing to have guests in your home. I am glad that the ministry takes time to visit us and see what we are doing after our graduation from the Bible School. I am grateful for the encouragement you give women by making us all realize we both have a role to play in ministry as well as in our society. Our culture allows for a male dominated society but the Word of God teaches us the truth. The Word shows how God first made Adam and gave him dominion on earth and then He fashioned Eve to help him fulfill his role as leader. Anyone who helps you at leading is simply leading with you. Eve was a leader in her own respect and the fact that she was a woman did not make her less a leader than Adam was. I am happy that this approach has completely dismantled the African way of thinking in my church. My wife has become a leader for other women as well and I am so blessed to have her by my side. I am happy the ministry has encouraged the women's ministry to change the status quo in our societies. We hope to radically teach these truths to more as well as encouraging more young girls to choose education and cut out early marriages in our region.

If there is anything this virus has done for me it is to recall the important things of my life and the living reality of Christ. We are here not by chance but by the love, grace, and power that is in the Blood of the Lamb.
